### MARY ALICE BROWN

Mary Alice Brown, singer and keyboard artist, has been a ubiquitous presence on the jazz scene in Erie since her return in the 1990's, as a performer, teacher and ambassador of jazz. Raised in Erie, Brown first performed here, then left for Hollywood and the big time in 1967. She played with many jazz greats, including Dexter Gordon, Kenny Burrell and Jimmy Smith, and toured internationally.

She was persuaded by former mayor Joyce Savocchio to return to Erie in the 1990's, to help engage young people by inspiring them to participate and communicate through music. She has been an active presence in the concert scene and in educational ventures ever since.

### DIXIE DOODLERS

A musical institution in the Erie area, the Dixie Doodlers are one of the aggregations led by the Haener brothers, in this case, Don (trumpet). With a history stretching back to the 1950's, the Doodlers follow the tradition of Dixieland music in instrumentation, rhythm and style, and offer an entertainment-focused presentation. As one of the few local groups presenting this early form of jazz, the band appears to have found an audience. The Doodlers have played hundreds of engagements from Pittsburgh, PA to Buffalo, NY during the past 50 years.

# JAZZERIE DISCUSSION GROUP

April 9, 2007

With the holiness church as a pedestal and the saints Charlie Parker and Duke Ellington on his left and right, Charles Mingus synthesized thirty-five years of jazz. My vinyl album of "Mingus Ah Um" is now a flimsy black veil. I'm working now on destroying the CD with a laser beam. Compositions like "Better Git It In Your Soul," "Boogie Stop Shuffle" and "Jelly Roll" played by an august cast including John Handy, Booker Ervin, Jimmy Knepper, Horace Parlan and Danny Richmond result in a grandiloquent musical experience.

Don Schwab brings us the John Fedchock band on which the trombonist/leader unfolds a lush solo on Thelonius Monk's "Ruby My Dear:" a marvelous rendition and a band of New York pros, many of whom play also with Maria Schneider's band, as Margitza, Perry, Robinson, Ries and Hagans. If big bands are a favorite for you, this album will seldom cool off from neglect.

We listened to two short pieces from clarinetist Sam Most: "Sometimes I'm Happy" and "Taking A Chance On Love." The group includes trumpeter Doug Mettome, pianist Dick Hyman, and Chuck Wayne on guitar. The sound is that easy going, unpretentious, small group swing to bop transition where everyone is obviously happy to be there. A 1952, 45rpm from Jim Metzler.

"Live," Jack McDuff at The Front Room in Newark, New Jersey in 1963. Can you hear the funk already? Like Al Lubiejewski, I'm a sucker for tenor fronted organ trios and thoroughly enjoyed the playing of saxophonists Red Holloway and Harold Vick. Joe Dukes manned the drum kit and young George Benson is on blues-marinated guitar. Thanks, Al, I needed that.

Albert Mangelsdorff has been a stalwart pioneer on the European jazz scene for decades. On this solo album the German trombonist creates multiphonics (chords) by humming while blowing into the mouthpiece. The improvisations are inventive and refreshing, a combination of Sonny Rollins' free improve, Tony Scott's "Dances For Clarinet" and the Mongolian Throat Singers. Thanks to Denny Kitchen.

## CLAIRE DALY AT PAPERMOON



We're finally getting it. There are great female jazz saxophonists around. And they seem to be willing to come to Erie.

Claire Daly has the kind of resume you're getting used to – started playing very well very young, fell in love with the Buddy Rich Big Band when she heard them live, attended Berklee College of Music in Boston, played baritone with the DIVA Big Band for seven years, also freelancing in New York. Backed singers from Aretha to Rosemary. Recorded 7 CD's – five with musical partner/composer Joel Forrester, two as a leader. Four-time winner of

Downbeat "Talent Deserving of Wider Recognition" poll, winner of JJA '05 baritone sax poll.

A recent project is interesting. While touring the country playing gigs, Daly is also tracking down some of the jazz world's hidden treasures, recording interviews on videotape in preparation for an eventual documentary.

Daly made an appearance in Erie a couple of years ago and the musicians who heard her and played with her were uniformly appreciative. She will appear on Saturday, June 16 at the papermoon, 14<sup>th</sup> and State, with Cats A Bear.

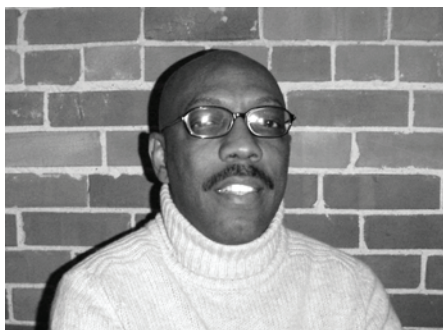

# JAZZ-E

Joe Curlett



Rare. Classic. Strong. Bad. Mood stirrers. Or just great listening. Some CDs absolutely fall in this category and we jazz lovers each have our own reasons and taste for labeling them as such. One probably cannot really pinpoint one stand alone, distinct “thing” that makes the music so special or appealing but, its musical amalgamation and totality just elevates it to be an all time favorite. For whenever it is played or heard, it takes you there with little facility and you know the musical chords and beats are setting you up for a musical treat beyond measure.

We all have our all-time favorite hit list, but these five CDs are offered for consideration as righteous cuts deserving to be included in that “number.” The great Hammond B-3 organist Jimmy Smith’s “The Sermon,” trumpeter par excellence Miles Davis’ “Kind of Blue,” supreme tenor saxophonist John Coltrane’s “The Best of John Coltrane,” super pianist Horace Silver’s “Song for My Father,” and yes, saxophonist and flutist Grover Washington, Jr.’s “Inner City Blues.” Each have reached that transcendent status by these musical titans. These jazz replications come with a guarantee to sooth your musical soul, mesh tunes with taste and bring out the creative juices that reside deep within that will surface into a pleasure point beyond performance. The sidemen were accomplished musicians in their own right and were welcome additions to the featured recording artist. Some of these sidemen recorded CDs of their own or were always in such demand

because of their musical prowess and great chemistry they brought to the music and band.

The signature musicians have created masterpieces that are timeless and tight, to only grab and enthrall the listener in a melodic journey beyond their realm of expectations. The pure satisfaction from this exceptional musical experience speaks to the origin, genre and skill set of each musician. They brought such presence and gave so much of themselves in their music because they loved, respected and believed in their art form.

So whatever your flavor or what musician or CD comprises your favorite hit list, maximize your enjoyment by repeating the experience as often as you like, because jazz gets the job done.

## THE HAENER BROTHERS

Prominent players in this year’s Erie Summerlong Jazz Fest will be Fred and Don Haener, “The Haener Brothers,” current scions of an Erie musical dynasty. Patriarch of the dynasty, Fred A. Haener, was born in 1910 and studied classical piano. He formed his first orchestra in Erie in the 1920’s. Fred and his wife Katherine had three sons, all of whom followed dad’s lead and became invested in music.

Son Fred T. studied piano, saxophone and clarinet, and became the band’s arranger. Son Don played piano,

trumpet and drums. Son Ron soon joined his brother on drums. Since their father’s death in 1995, Fred T. and Don have kept the family’s musical traditions alive with a variety of bands covering pop, ethnic and jazz styles. Eclectic hardly begins to describe it.

Advertising their craft as “dance music for all ages and any occasion,” the brothers also boasted a growing brood of younger Haeners “...starting to find their own musical talents and even appearing with the Haener Brothers Band.”
