General Klondike Derby Information:

- Lunch is to be a hot meal to be prepared that is carried on the sled for the morning and eaten on the trail and NOT in the parking lot.
- All sleds must be Klondike type sleds. No wheels are permitted. Sleds cannot be carried.
- Adult leaders are not permitted to help patrols in any way and will face possible disqualification of sled if seen.
- Webelos Leaders are permitted to provide minimal assistance.
- BSA Medical Form Parts A & B are required and must be shown at registration.
- Staff decisions are final.
- Stations must be completed in order.
- Scoring information will not be provided to patrols.
- 30 minute time limit to complete each individual station.
- **MAXIMUM OF 8 SCOUTS PER SLED ENFORCED FOR SAFETY OF SCOUTS**

Specific Station information: Basic Fire Building- No chemical fire starters (including lighters) will be permitted. Hill Climb: The ropes needed are required to be on the sled. There will be a rope on hill but it will only be there for safety reasons.

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Sled Requirements:

- Be prepared! All items **must** be on your sled for the **entire day!**
- No one will be allowed to return to their vehicle for lunch unless there is a medical or safety reason to obtain dry clothes.
- Keep this form with your Patrol Entry Form and be ready to produce it for sled judging.
- Sleds should be packed neatly and safely with some thought given to accessibility of often needed items.
- Sleds should have at least one leader or adult with them, for observation.

Supply List:

- Traditional Sled with ground cloth or tarp
- Clipboard with PENCIL (pen ink freezes)
- Compass
- Patrol roster: Patrol name, unit number, District, Scout names with addresses & phone numbers
- First aid kit including sunscreen
- Materials to make splints and slings
- Working cell phone and emergency contact sheet (in case of no reception or dead battery)
- Signaling device
- Stretcher or 2 stretcher poles
- 3 blankets
- Scout knife AND Totin Chip card (at least one per patrol)
- Saw in the appropriate safety case
- Fire building materials – including: fire starter (flint & steel, bow and drill, hot spark), hand ax with safety cover and at least 1 fireman chit card per patrol
- Saw in the appropriate safety case
- 3 - 25' ropes 3/8" diameter or larger
- 1 - 50' rope 3/8" diameter or larger
- 8 - 6' ropes 1/4" diameter
- 2 garbage bags
- 2 gallons of water (enough water for drinking and cooking)
- Personal water bottle required for each member of patrol
- Enough food to prepare a HOT lunch for your entire patrol
- Mess kit for each member of the patrol
- A small patrol and American Flag
- Scout Handbooks – you must have at least one
- EACH member has appropriate gloves, head and foot gear on
- Gloves for all members of your patrol
- Change of dry socks for all members of your patrol
